Together we monitor more than 7000 NGOs in Europe, Asia and America, representing more than 68 billion aggregated expenses.

CMW contributes to the strengthening of each of its members through the exchange of experiences, facilitating the incorporation of trends and new developments in the third sector. [EC1] The organisation has stood as a global beacon of charity integrity since its inception in 1958. CMW arose from the collective vision of national charity monitoring bodies that recognised the need for an international standard in the assessment of charitable operations.
